

Jefferson Awards for Public Service



Salesianum School was honored by the Jefferson Awards for Public Service as the Leadership School for the state of Delaware. Two of the school's student leaders, Dominic Taglione '09 and Robert Liszkiewicz

'09, were recognized at the Delaware Jefferson Awards Ceremony at the DuPont Country Club on April 23. Taglione represented Salesianum and the state of Delaware at the Jefferson Awards National Ceremony in Washington DC, June 16 – 18, where he, along with Christian Service Moderator Mrs. Dolores Ballintyn, had an audience with Delaware Senator Tom Carper.

The Jefferson Awards for Public Service and Deloitte launched the national youth recognition and reward program.
